2. Incidents: Two medical calls were responded to in the Park by the CPVFD Emergency Medical Services volunteers and other personnel. Both calls were in the upper park with one on Crystal Park Road and the other on Forest Road. CPVFD staff were first on scene providing patient care and vital signs to other arriving resources. Positive comments were received from MSFD responding advanced life support personnel regarding the super job the CPVFD EMS volunteers provided.

3. CPVFD Firefighters 4th of July and Pike Peak Race Support and Deploy to California: CPVFD supported the Manitou Springs 4th of July celebration and the Pikes Peak Hill Climb this month. Firefighters Charles Davis and John Hennessey from Crystal Park Volunteer Fire Department deployed to California in June and July to aid in fighting the more than 2000 wildfires burning in California. They supported 3 major Type 1 incident wildfire complexes involving firefighters from all over the country and received invaluable hands-on experience.
